Objection: "THE BIBLE CAN'T CHANGE BECAUSE GOD PRESERVES HIS WORD"

Answer: "WHERE DOES HE PRESERVE IT?"

1) I agree that God preserves His word....but do the scriptures specifically teach us WHERE he will preserve it?

a. **Promises that include WHERE it will be preserved**Jeremiah 31:33, Hebrews 8:10, Hebrews 10:16, 2nd Cor 3:3 Psalms 119:89

- b. Promises that DO NOT include WHERE it will be preserved
  Isaiah 40:8, Isaiah 55:11, Psalm 12:6, Psalm 119:89, Proverbs 30:5, Matthew
  5:18, Matthew 24:35, John 10:35, John 17:17, 2 Timothy 3:16-17, Revelation
  22:18-19
- c. **CONCLUSION:** There are no scriptures that teach that the word will be preserved on the pages of a book. Instead, it clearly teaches that the word will be preserved in the hearts of His people. 2<sup>nd</sup> Cor 3:3 specifically teaches that preservation will be "not with ink" and likens God's people to tablets of stone which is the only place that the scriptures teach that God's word was stored on an indelible medium.

Objection: "THE "BIBLE" CAN'T CHANGE BECAUSE GOD PRESERVES HIS "WORD"

Answer: WAIT...."THY "BIBLE" IS FOREVER SETTLED IN HEAVEN"?

Answer: ARE THE TERMS BIBLE, SCRIPTURE AND WORD SYNONOMOUS?

2) I agree that God preserves His word, but does He promise to preserve the scriptures?

a. **John 1:1** 

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."

b. Revelation 19:13

"He was clothed with a robe dipped in blood, and His name is called The Word of God."

- c. **Hebrews 4:12:** "The "Word of God" is living and powerful, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart."
  - i. **Hebrews 4:12**: "The Word of God is living
  - ii. **2 Cor 3:6 :** ...for the letter kills"
  - iii. Hebrews 4:12 says "the Word of God searches the hearts,"
  - iv. Revelation 22:23 says Jesus "searches the hearts"
    - 1. Revelation 22:23: "I am He who searches the minds and hearts."
- d. John 1:4 "In Him was life, and the life was the light of men"
- e. John 5:39 "You search the Scriptures, for in them you think you have eternal life; and these are they which testify of Me.

f. **CONCLUSION** - The term "Word" **clearly** does not **always** mean your KJB Bible in English. It is describing something much more profound. Therefore, God's promises to preserve His "Word" should not **always** be taken as a promise to preserve the physical scriptures or the Bible. We do not read; "Heaven and earth will pass away but my Bible will not pass away."

John 1:1 "...and the word was God." Can you hold your Bible in your hand and say; "I hold in my hand, God?" If the answer is no, then stop converting "Thy word is forever settled in heaven" to "Thy Bible is forever settled in heaven." There's no promise to preserve the Bible. Stop saying my Bible can't change because God preserves His word.

Objection: "YOU ARE CONFUSED BY VERSIONS"

Answer: "DON'T YOU KNOW YOUR BIBLE?"

- 1) How could we be confused by versions if the changes are in every version
- 2) Version confusion doesn't address the other various kinds of changes that have nothing to do with memory
  - a. Names with eighteen letters, word switches, new countries introduced, missing words, altered names, spelling, grammar, and syntax errors, changed stories and new stories, biblical paradoxes, cut-and-paste duplicates, ebonics, emojis, gibberish, and nonsense verses, duplicated words, massive run-on sentences, modern words, random capitalization and italics, blasphemy, sexual innuendo, ungodly themes.
- 3) If we we're confused by version we all wouldn't be misremembering the same way, but we are.
- 4) The idea that we're confused in our memories does not explain the Biblical paradoxes that now appear in every version
  - a. 2 Kings 18:27 People drinking their own piss and eating their own dung, Luke 19:27 Jihad Jesus slaying any who refuses to follow Him, Isaiah 8:3 Isaiah the prophet engaging in fornication with a prostitute, Mark 8:23 Jesus spitting in people's faces to heal them, Leviticus 4:32 Sacrificing female sheep, 2 Corinthians 11:8 Paul robbing churches, Isaiah 60:16 Sucking the breasts of kings, Psalm 137:9 Smashing babies against rocks makes you happy, Luke 18:15 Jesus touching babies, Ezekiel 23:20 Genitals like donkeys and emissions like horses, Zechariah 5:9 Female angels or women with wings, Mark 14:51-52, John 21:7 Streaking (Running naked), Exodus 12:23 God Himself is killing the firstborn of Egypt, 2 Corinthians 11:4 False teachers are to be tolerated
- 5) Don't you know your Bible?

- a. If "Jesus wept" was changed to "Jesus cried" in a few modern versions, would that be enough to trick you into thinking that all versions always said "Jesus cried."
- 2) Many of the changes that we have are in all versions, so how could we be confused by versions

Objection: YOU'RE RAISING YOUR MEMORY ABOVE THE AUTHORITY OF SCRIPTURES

Answer: NO, YOU'RE RAISING UP MAN'S OPINION ABOVE THE AUTHORITY OF

SCRIPTURE

- 1) No, you're raising up man's opinions above the authority of scriptures. You're teaching as doctrine, the traditions of man by embracing theological necessity. Can you explain what Theological necessity is because it's the foundation of the doctrine of preservation?
  - a. Theological necessity teaches; Because God inspired the word or because God went to so much trouble to give us His word, of course He's going to preserve it. But is that a doctrine? The 10 commandments is a doctrine.

## Objection YOUR CONFUSED BY MISQUOTES FROM POP CULTURE Answer DON'T YOU KNOW YOUR BIBLE?

- 2) If someone on Facebook posted there is no God, would you suddenly and without even realizing it, become an atheist
- 3) So what if I see a misquote on Facebook, don't you know your Bible?
- 4) If what you are saying is true, we would all be misremembering differently but we're not.

How is it possible that virtually every person in the entire world that knows their Bible, without exception, will misremember the following five passages in the exact same way. They will remember many more the same way, but I only need five to prove my point.

What's causing everyone to misremember the exact same wrong answer? The forest does not fall down without a great wind. So, what's the cause of this impossible unity of misremembering.

The scientific discipline of probabilities dictates that the chances of five people misremembering these five bible guiz questions the same way by chance is 10^25

That's 1 in 1,000,000,000,000,000,000,000

Unless you can provide a rational explanation for this repeatable empirical evidence, all of the following arguments are set aside.

- God preserves His word the Bible can't change
- The devil isn't that powerful
- You're misremembering
- o The human memory is unreliable
- You're confused by all the different versions
- o You're confused because you're biblically illiterate
- You're confused by misquotes from pop culture
- You're confused by modernization
- You're confused by misprints
- You're confused by implanted thoughts (Planter's peanut guy vs monopoly guy)
- You're delusional
- You're a charlatan or deceiver (In it for the money)
- You're deceived by a government psyop
- You're deceived by photoshopped tricks on the internet

The first two are KJV only so were not confused by versions. They would only exist in the KJV and they're not in the KJV. They don't exist in any translation anywhere in any century. So if you can't find them in any Bible, then how did they get into everyone's mind the same way. Remember, if everyone was simply confused by misquotes from pop culture or different versions or varients, we wouldn't be misremembering the same way. The other three examples are in all versions so you can't suggest that we're confused by versions.
