Found in KJV & most translations

Jihad Jesus slaying any who refuses to follow Him

- Luke 19:27 (Most translations) "But those mine enemies, which would not that I should reign over them, bring hither, and slay them before me."

Jesus Spitting in people's faces to heal them

- Mark 8: 23 (Most translations) - "And he took the blind man by the hand, and led him out of the town; and when he had spit on his eyes, and put his hands upon him, he asked him if he saw ought."

People drinking their own piss and eating their own dung

- 2 Kings 18: 27 (Most translations) - "But Rabshakeh said unto them, Hath my master sent me to thy master, and to thee, to speak these words? hath he not sent me to the men which sit on the wall, that they may eat their own dung, and drink their own piss with you?"

Sucking the breasts of kings

- Isaiah 60:16 (Most translations) - "Thou shalt also suck the milk of the Gentiles, and shalt suck the breast of kings: and thou shalt know that I the LORD am thy Saviour and thy Redeemer, the mighty One of Jacob."

Isaiah engaging in fornication with a prophetess

- Isaiah 8: 3 (Most translations) "Then I made love to the prophetess, and she conceived and gave birth to a son. And the Lord said to me, 'Name him Maher-Shalal-Hash-Baz. '"

Paul Robbing churches

- 2 Corinthians 11: 8 (Most translations) - "I robbed other churches, taking wages of them, to do you service."

There seems to be a lot more cannibalism in the Bible than I remember

- Ezekiel 5:10 (Most translations): "Therefore fathers will eat their sons in your midst, and sons will eat their fathers. I will inflict punishment on you and will scatter all your survivors to the winds."
- Micah 3:2-3 (Most translations): "You rulers hate good and love evil; you tear the skin from my people and the flesh from their bones. You eat the flesh of my people, strip off their skin, break their bones and chop them up like meat in a pot, like flesh in a cauldron."
- 2 Kings 6:28-29: (Most translations): "Give up your son so we may eat him today, and tomorrow we'll eat my son. So we cooked my son and ate him. The next day I said to her, 'Give up your son so we may eat him,' but she had hidden him."
- **Additional cannibalism scriptures:** Leviticus 26:29, Deuteronomy 28:53, Jeremiah 19:9, Lamentations 2:20, Ezekiel 5:8-10, Micah 3:2-3, Isaiah 9:19-20

- Genesis 27:26–27 — Isaac kisses Esau
- Genesis 33:4 — Esau kisses Jacob
- Genesis 45:15 — Joseph kisses his brothers.
- Exodus 4:27 — Aaron kisses Moses
- 1 Samuel 10:1 — Samuel kisses Saul).
- 1 Samuel 20:41 — Jonathan kisses David
- Acts 20:37 — And they began to weep loudly, and falling on Paul's neck, they kissed him.
- Romans 16:16 — Men greet each other with a holy kiss
- 1 Corinthians 16:20 — Men greet each other with a holy kiss
- 2 Corinthians 13:12 — Men greet each other with a holy kiss
- 1 Thessalonians 5:26 — Men greet each other with a holy kiss
- 1 Peter 5:14 — Men greet each other with a kiss of love

Genitals like donkeys

- Ezekiel 23:20 (Most translations) “There she lusted after her lovers, whose genitals were like those of donkeys and whose emission was like that of horses.”

Jesus touching babies

- Luke 18: 15 (Most translations) - "And they brought unto him also infants, that he would touch them: but when his disciples saw it, they rebuked them. .”

Sacrificing Female Sheep

- "Leviticus 4: 32 (Most translations) - "And if he bring a lamb for a sin offering, he shall bring it a female without blemish.”

The disciples stop at the bar to tilt a few

- Acts 28:15 (Most translations) And from thence, when the brethren heard of us, they came to meet us as far as Appii forum, and The three taverns: whom when Paul saw, he thanked God, and took courage.

Streaking in the Bible

- John 21:7 Therefore that disciple whom Jesus loved saith unto Peter, It is the Lord. Now when Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he girt *his* fisher's coat *unto him*, (for he was naked,) and did cast himself into the sea.
- Mark 14:51 And there followed him a certain young man, having a linen cloth cast about *his* naked *body*; and the young men laid hold on him:

Smashing babies against rocks makes you happy

- Psalm 137:9 (Most translations) - "Happy shall he be, that taketh and dasheth thy little ones against the stones."

Female Angels or women with wings

- Zechariah 5:9 (Most translations) - "Then lifted I up mine eyes, and looked, and, behold, there came out two women, and the wind was in their wings; for they had wings like the wings of a stork: and they lifted up the ephah between the earth and the heaven."

666 appearing several more times in the bible in addition to the original reference in Revelations:

- **Rev 13** –Here is wisdom. Let him that hath understanding count the number of the beast: for it is the number of a man; and his number is Six hundred threescore and six.

- **1 Kings 10:14** / 2 Chron 9:13 Now the weight of gold that came to Solomon in one year was six hundred threescore and six talents of gold,
- **Ez 2:13** The children of Adonikam, six hundred sixty and six.

Name any reference in the scripture to extra biblical books or influences outside the Bible

1. Is it not written in the book of Jasher (Joshua 10:13, 2nd Sam 1:17)
2. Enoch, the seventh from Adam, also prophesied about them (Jude 1:14)

How many times are the 10 commandments listed in the Bible? Are any of the 10 commandments included in a list that includes ceremonial laws?

The Ten Commandments most famously appear in:

- Exodus 20:1–17
- Deuteronomy 5:6–21

However, Exodus 34:11–28 is being called a "renewed covenant", and verse 28 even says: *"he wrote upon the tables the words of the covenant, the ten commandments."*

But the content of Exodus 34 is significantly different from the traditional Ten Commandments in Exodus 20. Only 3 to 4 of the traditional Ten Commandments (no other gods, no idols, Sabbath, possibly coveting) appear in Exodus 34. The rest are replaced with ceremonial and covenantal laws unique to Israel.

Fornication & adultery condoned

- Hosea 4:14 I will not punish your daughters when they commit whoredom, nor your spouses when they commit adultery: for themselves are separated with whores, and they sacrifice with harlots: therefore the people *that* doth not understand shall fall.
